




Fig. 1 - Typical Output Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Output Characteristics




Fig. 3 - Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig. 4 - Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature




Fig. 5 - Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 6 -  $C_{OSS}$  and  $E_{OSS}$  vs.  $V_{DS}$ 






Fig. 7 - Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 8 - Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig. 9 - Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig. 10 - Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig. 11 - Temperature vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage






Fig. 12 - Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig. 13 - Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient




Fig. 14 - Switching Time Test Circuit

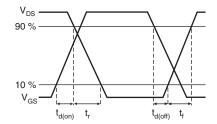


Fig. 15 - Switching Time Waveforms






Fig. 16 - Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig. 17 - Unclamped Inductive Waveforms




Fig. 18 - Basic Gate Charge Waveform





Fig. 19 - Gate Charge Test Circuit



#### Peak Diode Recovery dV/dt Test Circuit






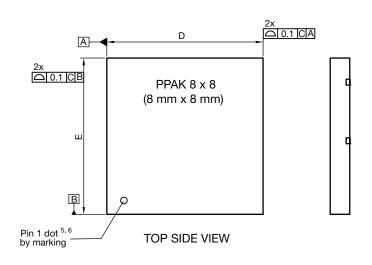
Fig. 20 - For N-Channel

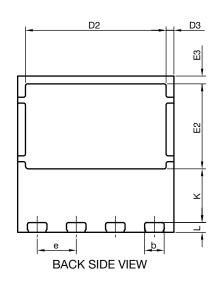
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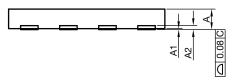

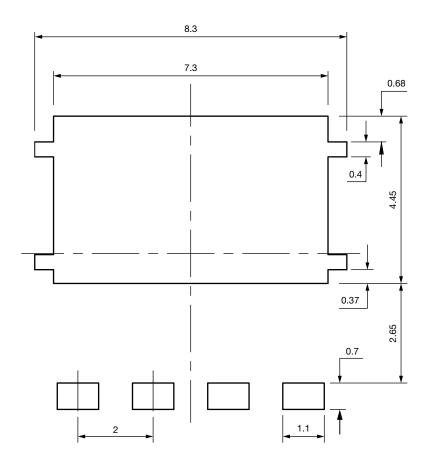
